Job Description:

Recruit & Engage Student Leaders

- Working with the Student Engagement Network (WA-SEN) Advisors, recruit a diverse group of student leaders (especially undergraduates) to engage with legislators in the district and in Olympia during the session.
- Identify, train, and supervise student liaisons, volunteers/participants and future interns in assigned region.
- Facilitate both virtual and in-person legislative interactions, including in-district meetings and advocacy efforts in Olympia.

Build & Strengthen Student Networks

- Organize and lead student groups throughout the year in online and in-person settings.
- Foster collaboration among students passionate about higher education policy.
- Network with **fellow students, school clubs, and student government** to expand WA-SEN's reach with support from liaisons when applicable.
- Work with liaisons to request professors to **forward WA-SEN event invitations** to students in their courses and distribute event posters to campuses in your assigned region.

Mobilize Advocacy Efforts

- Educate legislators on the importance of **financial aid expansion and higher education attainment**.
- Lead self-directed engagement initiatives, using both virtual and in-person strategies.
- Receive coaching and support from WA-SEN to enhance advocacy efforts.
- Attend **town hall events in your legislative district**, representing WA-SEN and preparing to ask questions related to WA-SEN's goals and concerns.

Host & Support Campus Advocacy Events

- **Table at campus events** to increase awareness and recruit student advocates.
- Help organize or assist in WA-SEN events at your college.

Commit to Full Participation in WA-SEN Events

- Work with the WA-SEN team to plan, prepare and host annual WA-SEN events.
- Attend **all required WA-SEN events** unless prohibited by school, work, or family obligations.
- **Engage actively in all virtual events** by turning on video, contributing to the chat, and assisting as needed.

Signature WA-SEN Events

- **Constitution Day (September, exact date TBD)** – Constitution Day and Citizenship Day, September 17, is designated to commemorate the signing of the

U.S. Constitution in Philadelphia on September 17, 1787. This nationally recognized holiday is intended to promote education around the Constitution.

- **Fall Summit (October/November, exact dates TBD)** – A key networking and training opportunity. If unable to attend, you must coordinate with WA-SEN.
- **Student Engagement Day in Olympia (Late January/Early February, exact dates TBD)** – A major advocacy event where students meet directly with legislators.
